**A BRIEF NOTE ON DIRECTOR OF ENFORCEMENT**

**INTRODUCTION:-**

The Government through G.O.Ms. No. 398 Revenue dt. 24.4.1974 created the post of an Officer on Special Duty in the rank of Deputy Inspector General of Police to work out a scheme for strengthening the enforcement machinery to deal with various types of Excise crime. On the recommendation of Board of Revenue and the Government by G.O.Ms. No. 639, (Revenue) dated. 19.5.1975 created a Directorate of Enforcement and the Officer on Special Duty was designated as Director of Enforcement (Excise).

**ABOUT:-**

The **Enforcement wing** of the Prohibition & Excise Department is headed by the Director of Enforcement (Proh.& Excise), who is a senior I.P.S., officer in the cadre of Deputy Inspector General of Police, working under the administrative of the Commissioner of Prohibition & Excise. There is one Joint Commissioner of Prohibition & Excise (Enforcement), one Deputy Commissioner of Prohibition & Excise (Enforcement) and one Assistant Secretary (Enforcement) in the office assisting the Director of Enforcement.

In addition to the above, at the state level under the control of Director of Enforcement (Proh & Excise) there is a State Task Force with (8) teams i.e (4) Police teams and (4) Excise teams. The (4) Police teams are headed by one Additional Superintendent of Police, the (4) Excise teams are headed by one Assistant Commissioner of Proh & Excise separately. Each Police team is headed by one Deputy Superintendent of Police and each Excise team is headed by one Proh & Excise Superintendent. The main function of State Task force is to develop intelligence network, gather intelligence on interstate smuggling of raw adulterants used for toddy adulteration, inflow of Non duty paid/ spurious Liquor etc.,

One control room is functioning at headquarters, round the clock in the O/o. the Director of Enforcement.

In addition to the above, one contingent of Police Constables of SAR/ CPL, Amberpet is on deputation to this Department.

At the field level, there are (23) Assistant Commissioners of Proh. & Excise (Enforcement) in the (23) Districts working under the control of the Deputy Commissioners concerned.

**1. INTRODUCTION: -**

The A.P.Geeta Parisramika Sahakara Arthika Samkshema Samstha, Hyderabad was constituted by the State Government Vide G.O.Ms.No.1078, Revenue (Ex-II) Department, dt.29-11-1991 to provide long term measures for the economic upliftment of the poor Toddy Tappers who are in dire poverty and whose profession involves lot of risk. The Samstha was registered in the year 1991 under A.P. Coop. Societies Act 7 of 1964.

**MANAGEMENT:**

The Samstha has been accorded with the official nominated body comprising of (11) members with Principal Secretary for Revenue (Ex-II) Department as its chairman on expiry of the term of the non-official Chairman with effect from 1-7-2007. And of late the State Government through G.O.Ms.No.620 dt.13-7-2010 has extended the term of the present official body for a period of another (2) years.

**ABOUT:-**

The major objectives of the Samstha are to plan, promote, undertake and assist in production, transportation, storage, marketing of toddy, development of other ancillary industries like palm, fiber, jaggery, beverages etc., and taking such other welfare measures to improve the overall quality of life of the Tappers community. They constitute 16% of the Backward Classes of the A.P., State.

**COVERAGE OF INSURANCE TO TODDY TAPPERS:-**

The Corporation acted as facilitator in insuring the lives of the Toddy Tappers under Janatha Personal Accident Policy introduced by the United India Insurance Company Limited and Oriental Insurance Company with a premium of Rs.175/- for a period of 5 & 10 years. The scheme covers the following packages.

- 1) Rs.1,00,000/- incase of death due to accident
- 2) Rs.1,00,000/- loss of 2 legs or 2 eyes or one eye, one leg/ one hand.
- 3) Rs.1,00,000/- complete incapacitation
- 4) Rs. 50,000/- Loss of leg or eye/hand

Under the said scheme the corporation has insured the lives of 11,639 Toddy Tappers in the State. The schemes had been dispensed with on completion of its duration. Negotiations are going on for further continuity in coverage of Insurance to the eligible tappers for ensuing years with the approval of the state government.

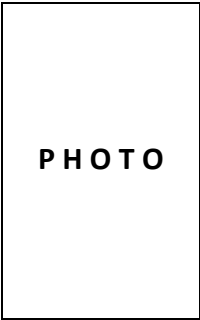

## **PERFORMANCE**

The Samstha with much efforts and with the cooperation of the Excise department has recovered and repaid Rs. 7.96 crores by March 2008 and later the Government also on the plight of the tappers, as the drought prevailed along time, has kindly assisted and cleared Rs. 8.10 crores to the NBCFDC by 31-3-2010 under **One Time Settlement Scheme**. The total amount thus repaid to NBCFD was Rs.16.06 crores, against the receives of Rs.12.58 crores. The G.O. relating to the waiver of loans to the Backward Classes was announced by the Government in 2009. The applicability of the G.O. on the waiver to the tappers is still awaited from the Government as it was not marked officially to the APGPSASS. The Government has been addressed in this regard relating to the confirmation of the waiver through a **Government order**.

Under the Janatha Personal Accidental scheme the corporation has got insured the lives of 11,639 Toddy Tappers in the State. 58 Accidental Policies under Janatha Personal Accidental Scheme have been claimed by the Corporation for Rs.25,50,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Lakhs Fifty Thousand only) and the amount was paid to 58 victim families in the State.

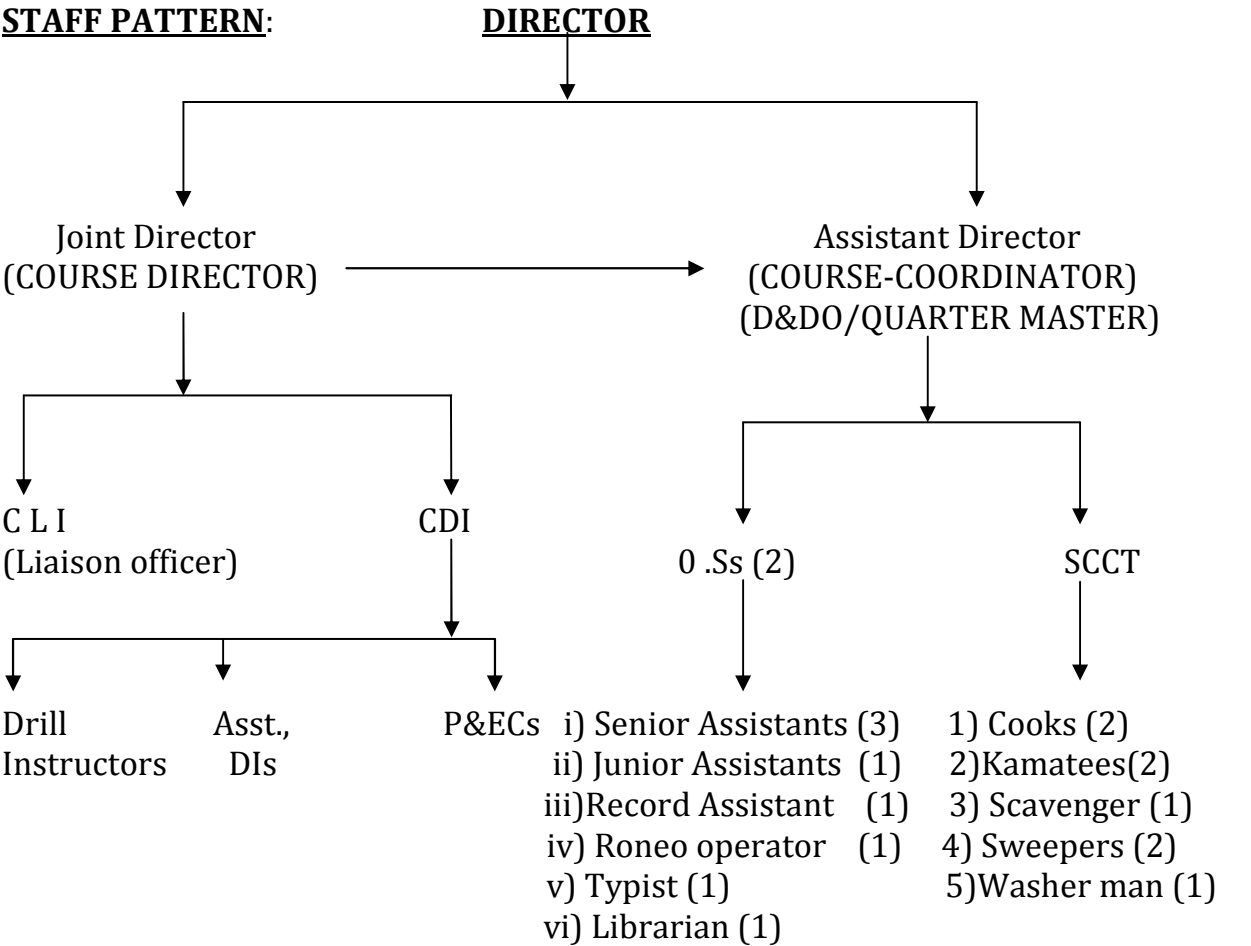
